A BILL FOR AN ACT

To amend Yap State Law No. 11-112, by amending the Title and Section 1 therein to appropriate an additional \$16,602 from the Special Revenue Fund of the State of Yap for the Tuberculosis Prevention Program in the Department of Health Services, and for other purposes.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Yap.

1 Section 1. Title of Yap State Law No. 11-112 is hereby
2 amended to read as follows:

3 "To appropriate the sum of ~~\$43,013,500~~60,515.50 from the
4 Special Revenue Fund of the State of Yap for the purpose
5 of appropriating U.S. Federal grant funds awarded for
6 public health programs with the Department of Health
7 Services during Fiscal Year 2025, and for other
8 purposes."

9 Section 2. Section 1 of Yap State Law No. 11-112 is
10 hereby amended to read as follows:

11 "Section 1. The sum of ~~\$43,013,500~~60,515.50, or so much
12 thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the
13 Special Revenue Fund of the State of Yap for the purpose of
14 providing funding to fund public health programs with the
15 Department of Health Services during Fiscal Year 2025. The sum
16 appropriated shall be deemed from United States Federal Grants
17 awarded for health programs as follow:

18 (1) FY2025 Yap HIV/AIDS Prevention

1 Program..... \$ 21,766;

2 (Grant No. 5 NU52PS910242-03-00,
3 expiring on December 31, 2025)

4 (2) FY2025 TB Program Program \$ ~~16,600~~33,202; and

5 (Grant No. 5 NU52PS910242-03-00/

6 6 NU52PS910242-03-01, Advice No.

7 52Y25030, expiring on December 31, 2025)

8 (3) FY2024 Yap State Development

9 Initiative (SSDI) \$ 5,547.50.

10 (Grant No. 5 H18MC00060-32-00,

11 expiring on November 30, 2025)“

12 Section 3. Conditions and Restrictions.

13 (1) Funds appropriated by this Act shall not be
14 available for obligation for their planned uses by the agency
15 until the respective grant cash amounts have been drawn down
16 by the State and are deposited in their respective State
17 accounts and available for disbursement.

18 (2) The sum appropriated by this Act shall not be
19 advanced to the agency. Memorandum of agreement (MOA) or
20 other forms of agreement the purpose of which is to obligate
21 and disburse to the agency any amounts from the sum
22 appropriated herein, including reimbursements for payments is
23 prohibited.

24 (3) All funds appropriated by this Act shall be

1 maintained under the authority of the Director of the Office
2 of Administrative Services.


3 Section 4. Allotment and Management of Funds, and
4 Lapse Date. The sum appropriated by this Act shall be
5 allotted to the Governor who shall be responsible for ensuring
6 these funds are used only for the purposes specified under
7 Section 1 of this Act. The sum appropriated by this Act shall
8 be administered in accordance with the provisions of
9 applicable law, including, but not limited to, the State
10 Financial Management Act of 1983 and the State Contracts Act.
11 The authority to obligate the funds appropriated by this Act
12 shall lapse as of the respective dates as specified under each
13 grant item under Section 1 of this Act, and any part of this
14 appropriation not obligated as of the date specified for each
15 grant under Section 1 shall revert to the Special Revenue Fund
16 of the State of Yap.

17 Section 5. Reports. The Governor shall submit to the
18 Legislature the performance and financial quarterly reports
19 for each quarter in each fiscal year no later than twenty days
20 after the end of each quarter. Each quarterly report shall
21 include, but not limited to, complete descriptions of the
22 obligations incurred against the funds appropriated by this
23 Act, and the status of the funds as of the end of the
24 completed quarter.

1 Section 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval
2 by the Governor, or upon its becoming law without such
3 approval.
